So, reference is a relation on the semantic level, whereas substitution is a relation on the lexicogrammatical level (the level of grammar and vocabulary, the linguistic form). Ellipsis is in this respect simply a kind of substitution: it can be defined as substitution by zero. 17

Ellipsis. Ellipsis as a type of cohesive relation is very similar to substitution. While substitution referred to the replacement of one textual element by another, ellipsis is simply characterized by "the omission of an item" (HALLIDAY & HASAN 1994:88).

The prefix "exo" means "outside", and the persons or events referred to in this manner are never identified by the writer. Halliday and Hasan considered exophoric reference as not cohesive, since it does not tie two elements together into in text. Ellipsis. Ellipsis is another cohesive device. It happens when, after a more specific mention, words are omitted when the phrase must be repeated.

It refers to relations of meaning that exists within the text. So, when this happens, a relation of cohesion is set up, and the two elements, the presupposing and the presupposed, are thereby integrated into a text. Halliday and Hasan (1976: 39) classify grammatical cohesion into reference, substitution, ellipsis and conjunction.
